The Pastor's Lenten Ponderings

Recently I had a call from a member of our church family. As we chatted, she said that she had a question about Lent: With Ash Wednesday being on February 14, and Lent being 40 days long, how come the math doesn't work – it's more than 40 days from February 14 until Easter on April 1? Good question! The answer is that Lent is 40 days from Ash Wednesday to Easter, not including Sundays. Sundays are not counted because we celebrate Jesus' resurrection every Sunday. In addition, forty days are observed in the Lenten season in memory of the forty days Jesus spent being tempted in the wilderness.

This year, I invited our entire church family to join in observing Lent together. On five consecutive Wednesday's that began on February 21 and will conclude on March 21, we took a Lenten journey. Each Wednesday evening, we gathered at 6:00 PM to share soup and conversation, followed at 6:30 discussion focused on Marcus J. Borg's book *Meeting Jesus Again for the First Time*. Borg's book challenged us to examine how we view Jesus as both savior and as a historical figure.

I would like to invite you to join your church family for our Easter week observances: Our Maundy Thursday service is on March 29 at 7:00pm, Easter Sunrise service at 6:30am on Easter morning, our 10:00am Easter worship service which will be followed by our annual Easter Egg Hunt.

Whether you joined us for our Lenten book study or our upcoming special services, I urge you to spend the forty days of Lent in reflection and preparation for the greatest celebration of our Christian faith – Easter, the day of the resurrection of our Lord. On Easter, Christ triumphed over the grave, leaving behind an empty tomb to forever remind us He is not dead, He does not sleep, He is alive!
