

The Pastor's Lenten Ponderings




I once had a call from a member of our church family. As we chatted, they said that they had a question about Lent: With Ash Wednesday being on March 5, and Lent being 40 days long, how come the math doesn't work – it's more than 40 days from March 5 until Easter on April 20? Good question!



The answer is that Lent is 40 days from Ash Wednesday to Easter, excluding Sundays. Sundays are not counted because we celebrate Jesus' resurrection every Sunday. In addition, 40 days are observed in the Lenten season in memory of the 40 days Jesus spent being tempted in the wilderness.

This year, I invited our entire church family to join in observing Lent together. On five



consecutive Tuesdays that begin on March 11 and conclude on April 8, we will take a Lenten journey. Each Tuesday at 1 p.m. we will gather in the parlor to discuss "Meeting Jesus at the Table" by Cynthia M. Campbell and Christine Coy Fohr.

I would also like to invite you to join our faith community for our Easter week observances: Our Maundy Thursday service is on April 17 at 7 p.m.; Easter Sunrise service at 6 a.m. on Easter morning, April 20; our 10 a.m. Easter worship service which will be followed by our annual Easter Egg Hunt.

Whether you join us for our Lenten book study or our Holy Week services, I urge you to spend the 40 days of Lent in reflection and preparation for the greatest celebration of our Christian faith – Easter, the day of the resurrection of our Lord. On Easter, Christ triumphed over the grave, leaving behind an empty tomb to forever remind us He is not dead, He does not sleep, He is alive!

Church Event honors Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. for 27th Year

Our church was proud to host the 27th annual Martin Luther King Jr. Celebration on Jan. 26 featuring guest speaker, Stephanie Thomas, Connecticut's 75th Secretary of State. Two students, Vaidehi Patel of Joseph A. DePaolo Middle School and Ekam Singh of John F. Kennedy Middle School, were honored. A special reception followed. This event is the only one in Southington that honors Dr. King.

The Rev. Sharon Holt commented, "Dr. King was far more than the leader of the Civil Rights Movement in the middle of the 20th century in America; Dr. King had a vision for all people to flourish under just laws, equitable distribution of wealth and equal protection under the law...Dr. Martin Luther King was assassinated 57 years ago this



year on April 4, 1968. His legacy lives on in the hearts and minds of seekers of peace and justice for all. We are proud to honor him today."

Focusing on the theme, "Serving the Least of These," Thomas remarked in part: "Dr. King once said, 'Our lives begin to end the day we become silent about things that matter.' So let's not be silent. Civic engagement isn't just about voting, it's about showing up, speaking up and being a

voice for the ones who can't find their voice.

"Let's remember that being informed and engaged isn't about taking sides, it isn't about politics. It's about taking responsibility to help shape the policies that affect our lives and the lives of those we're

called to serve. Dr. King believed in the power of collective action to create change. I believe it too. Do you believe it?... Every person here today has the power to make a difference... Now let's get to work."


